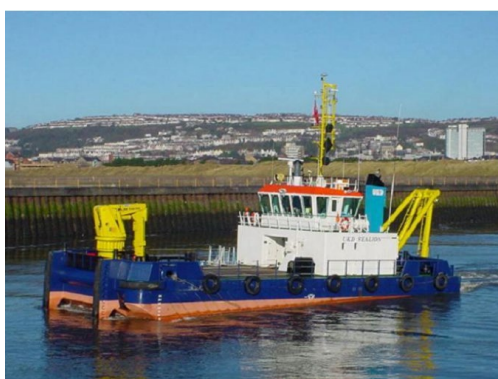
Seasonal Maintenance Dredging – Summer/Autumn 2022

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the trailing suction hopper dredger UKD BLUEFIN will be engaged in dredging operations in the main channels, swinging grounds and berths in the Rivers Itchen and Test, Port of Southampton, Southampton Water and the Thorn Channel for a period of approximately 43 days commencing on or around 1st September 2022.

Bed levelling will also be carried out by the bed levelling tender UKD SEALION in berths and channels as necessary in conjunction with the dredging programme. This work will commence on 7th August 2022 for approximately 100 days.



Dredging and bed levelling will commence at Esso – Fawley Marine Terminal on 1st September 2022 for a period of 12 days and at Solent Gateway Marchwood on 15th September 2022 for a period of 5 days in conjunction with the ABP maintenance works.



The dredgers and tender will display lights and shapes as required by the International Regulations for the Prevention of Collisions at Sea and mariners are requested to reduce speed as safe navigation permits when passing them whilst engaged in underwater activities.

Weather allowing, these operations will be continuous throughout the stated period and mariners should expect to pass UKD BLUEFIN at any time between the upper reaches of Southampton Water and the Nab Disposal Ground.

The dredgers will maintain a listening watch on VHF Channel 12 throughout dredging operations and mariners may also request movement information from Southampton VTS on VHF Channel 12.
